## ITALIAN SOCIALIST HARSHLY CONDEMNS THE KING'S SPEECH

Catholics and Socialists Clash in Chamber.

SPEECH A DEAD THING

Deputy Declares King's Pronouncement List of Everything Left Undone.

ROME, Tuesday, Dec. 9.-Deputy Benteni, Socialist, and Deputy Crispoldi, Catholic, discussed in the Chamber today King Victor Emmanuel's speech from the throne. The former denounced every part of the king's address. He declared that the Socialist group was in favor of a republic, not because of their love of a republic, but in order to insure the triumph of Socialism.

Deputy Grispoldi criticized the failure of the king to lay greater emphasis on the development of education, but lauded the speech as a whole. He was much heckled by the Socialists, who objected to his compliments to the king saving his certified to help compliments. king, saying his party had recognized the pope, and not the king as their head, always calling the latter a

When Deputy Crispoldi spoke favorably of the League of Nations the Socialists hissed and shouted: "It does not exist. What we want is a society of peoples."

Not Only Victors.

Deputy Crispoldi said: "One thing alone can save us in this critical situation. That is a spirit of Christian resignation." The Catholics applauded, but the Socialists again hissed and shouted: "Shame on you, acolytes." The deputy said the object of the Catholics was to bring about a vast economic, social and moral reconstruction. Turning to the Socialists, he detion. Turning to the Socialists, he de-clared: "You were not alone the victors in the general election, but we also." The Socialists shouted: "Unfortunate-

Deputy Crispoldi asserted that governmental institutions must be made more popular among the masses. He urged the Government to protect those who fought for Italy and those who still wore the military uniform. He said his party desired legal recognition of all Catholic organizations. The Socialists interrupted, and the deputy explained that the party desired that this recognition be extended to all organizations without distinction of faith. He praised the Socialists for their work in raising the masses from ignorance. The Socialists retorted: "When we did this your priests were against us." Crispoldi ended by speaking the words of King Emmanuel II. concerning the Catholic party: "The Catholics have not been insensible to the cry of sorrow of the Italians."

## **DUTCH DEPUTY SAYS EX-KAISER PROVING** MENACE TO HOLLAND

Urges That Question of His Extradition Be Seriously Considered.

THE HAGUE. Dec. 16.—(By the Associated Press.)—"If previously we have not regarded him as a danger to our country, he is now proving to be a danger," said Deputy Sannes in the Chamber of Deputies today, referring to former Emperor William of Germany. The deputy was dealing with a book written by Carl Kautzky, a German socialist, which Sannes declares showed that the former emperor was the cause of the world war. The data in Kautzky's book is said to have been obtained from official archives in Berlin.

Deputy Sannes asked the Government to reconsider the question of the sojourn at Amerogen of the former emperor, and seriously to consider the question of his extradition.
