Rev. J. W. Pedley Tells What Congregationalism Has Done For the World.

"To h— with the pope is its little ery." said Rev. J. W. Pedley at the Tcronto District Congregational Association convention yesterday, referring to the meaning of Protestantism, during an address on "What Congregationalism has done for the World." The Protestant, as we understand, opposes church government." he addchurch government," he add

Rev. Mr. Pedley was showing the difference in what Protestantism stood for and what Congregationalism stood for. His address was really on the value of Congregational principles, and what they have done for the religious life of the world. The foundation principle, he explained, was freedom of thought and enquiry, a principle which had lived before the Bible and which made the Bible. It was principle that has made and unmade theology.

"stands for the supremacy of the in-dividual as against any ecclesiastical system. History has shown that system and individuality are at warfare, and where system prevails, the individual has suffered." Congregationalism sees clearly that the business of the church is not to form creeds, but to make man and form character."

TRENTON, N. J., April 20.—Trenton's new "no seat no fare" ordinance has already worked wonders in the way of improved trolley service, althout only went into effect yesterday. The company ran more cars during the rush hours to-day than ever before, as it did not want to face heavy fines, the new ordinance providing that whenever the corporation fails to provide a seat for passengers during rush hours it is liable to a penalty of \$50 for each complaint.
