canteen, the good results being acknowledged by officers in command. Names and addresses of 43 enquirers were received. Three professed conversion, and many Christians were strengthened. The names secured both this and the past year will be written to before the Camp assembles again, and in this way united effort will be secured with the men on behalf of their fellows. The Tent served as a resort where those who visited could escape the profanity so inseparable from camp life. We desire to thank all the friends, both at St. Johns and in Montreal, who assisted in so many ways to make the work a success.

The Tent this year is our own property, so that the total expenses were only \$18.22, towards which \$10.25 was received from the officers of the 11th Battalion, per Major Lamb.
