As outlined in unofficial despatches, it contained no request for Greek intervention in the war with the allies, but asked Greece to give assurance that she would preserve her friendly attitude in case the allied troops now in Macedonia should be compelled to retreat across the frontier to Greek territory.

London, Nov. 25—Although the full text of the Greek government's reply to the Entente powers' note had not yet been made public in England, there is every indication that the British government is satisfied with the position taken at Athens. The assurances given by Greece differ in marked degree from the previous expressions of benevolent neutrality. They are neither vague nor evasive, but promise explicitly that no similar measures will be taken against the Serbian, French or British troops in case they retreat to Greek
