MOTHERS' ALLOWANCES.

Toronto, Oct. 20.—In a statement given out from the office of the mothers' allowances commission, it is shown that at the present time there are 5,856 beneficiaries, with 7,978 children. Of the beneficiaries, 2,210 are widows, forty are wives whose husbands are in an asylum; sixteen women have husbands permanently incapacitated, a great many of these being in sanitariums for tuberculosis; forty-three are wives who have been deserted for five years or more, and seven are foster-mothers.

The city of Toronto has 551 cases, Ontario 202, and Hamilton ninety-eight. The total sum at the present time being expended is \$91,272.

U. S. MARKET IS GOOD FOR VALLEY

States Taking All the Apples United Fruit Co. Can Get Vessels For.

In view of the fact that the railway is hauling train loads after train loads of apples to Yarmouth and Halifax for shipment to Boston and southern points, A. E. McMahon, the general manager of the United Fruit Company, Limited, the largest shippers in Nova Scotia, was called up here and here is what he had to say.

The eastern and southern states are taking all the apples we can get. We are endeavoring for several days to get ships either steam or sail, to carry apples from Kingsport to New York, Boston and Baltimore, without success. Apple shipments from this valley this season approximate a quarter of a million barrels, being fully 80 per cent more than any previous year up this season. Markets in England indicate a firm market and an increasing demand; the same may be said of the United States. It keeps up there will be an apple famine in European and United States markets before spring.

In a later statement Mr. McMahon said that he had succeeded in chartering two steamers, one from Kingsport to Baltimore, to carry apples. These two ships will carry about ten thousand barrels.
