French Government Premium Loan 5% Coupon Bonds

These bonds will be a direct obligation of the French Republic. Interest is payable May 1st and November 1st. The first coupon will be paid November 1st, 1920, and will be for 35 francs, which includes the regular semi-annual coupon of 25 francs and 10 francs to cover the interest accrued to May 1st. Principal, interest and premium of this loan are payable free of French taxes.

The subscription price is payable in full at the time of subscription.

The franc has advanced gradually in price since January 1st, 1920, the total appreciation being over 16 p. c.
