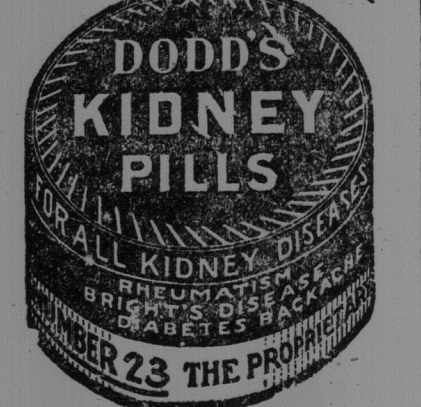

## ORGANIZATION FOR RED TRIANGLE DRIVE

A largely attended meeting to complete organization for the Red Triangle drive in this city in May was held at the board of trade rooms last evening. Premier W. E. Foster, city and county chairman, presiding, Capt. A. Campbell told of the work of the Y. M. C. A. Captain Read, who has been in charge of Red Triangle work on the transports, also told of this branch of the work. It is proposed to raise \$1,000,000 in Canada, of which New Brunswick's share is \$50,000. St. John city is expected to raise \$20,000. The organization for the province and city was perfected as follows:

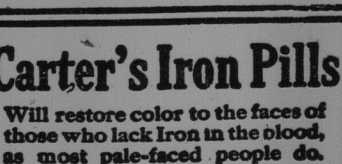

The opposition at Ottawa has heard that the government intends to hold a general election late in the year, appealing to the people on a public ownership platform, also on any reductions they may make in the tariff.

The plebiscite on daylight saving held in Fredericton yesterday resulted in the defeat of the measure, the vote being 355 for and 483 against.

Chief Rideout and Inspector Belliveau seized eighty-two gallons of liquor yesterday, which were stored away in a Pullman car on the Ocean Limited for Halifax. No arrests were made, the conductor and porter both denying any knowledge of the liquor.
