The race is one which will be remembered for years. The Harvard men made up the best crew ever sent out from the United States, and I think this was due to the influence of Mr. Lehmann's coaching on his last visit to Massachusetts.

The Harvard men, as I noticed in the preliminary paddles, have some of the characteristics of English rowing, more than that of today's English waters, but their style reminds me more of the English rowing of some years ago.

Col. Willan in proposing a toast to the crew, pointed out that the race was rowed on the anniversary of the foundation of Harvard college.

At the dinner following the race in 1863, Col. Willan said: 'Charles Dickens was one of the speakers and Dickens predicted that there would be other contests of this kind between Harvard and Cambridge had not succeeded this time, but he warned English oarsmen that Harvard was dangerous.
