# HIS EXCUSE FOR MURDER WILL BE EPILEPTIC INSANITY

Counsel Indicates Defense for Chester S. Jordan-Many Legal Medical

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., April 27.—Epileptic insanity is the life preserver with which the counsel for Chester S. Jordan hope to bring him safely through the trial for the murder of his wife, Honora, according to the statement made in the opening of the defense today.

Pending the introduction of testimony in support of this theory of his condition at the time of the murder and perhaps both before and after it, Jordan's counsel showed today a decided disposition to question the government's theory of the exact cause of Mrs. Jordan's death. Half a dozen well known physicians occupied the stand most of the day and until just before the close the trial bristled with legal medical questions and answers. curately the exact cause of the wo-

The man and woman, who went through a form of marriage ceremony in Paris, Ont., in February, were living together with eight children of the two by former marriages, in the most terrible poverty, in a community of well-to-do farmers, who must have known of their condition, but who neglected for months to notify the authorities.
