PROBE TO BE MADE AT FREDERICTON

Week after next is likely time for investigation into charges. — Hon. J. E. Michaud protest against place of probe for reason of economy.

Fredericton, April 20. — The investigation by the Department of Public Works into the charges of payroll padding, leveled against several road supervisors in Restigouche and Madawaska counties by J. E. Michaud, Opposition, Madawaska, before the Public Accounts Committee of the Legislature, will probably commence at Fredericton the week after next, it was stated tonight by R. P. Hartley, Deputy Attorney-General, who has been appointed to take charge of the enquiry.

Fredericton, April 20. — The investigation by the Department of Public Works into the charges of payroll padding, leveled against several road supervisors in Restigouche and Madawaska counties by J. E. Michaud, Opposition, Madawaska, before the Public Accounts Committee of the Legislature, will probably commence at Fredericton the week after next, it was stated tonight by R. P. Hartley, Deputy Attorney-General, who has been appointed to take charge of the enquiry. We understand that Mr. Michaud has sent immediate protestations to the government against holding a probe at Fredericton, as in the case the province will have to bear the traveling and board expenses of more than 100 witnesses, while these would not be as high if the investigation was held at Campbellton, Edmundston or elsewhere in these counties.

CAR HURLES INTO AIR AFTER STRIKING DEPRESSION IN ROAD. Fredericton, April 19. — Irvin Dykeman, 35, of Salmon Creek, Sunbury county, died today in Victoria hospital, Fredericton, of injuries sustained yesterday when the car which he was driving hurtled into the air and crashed to the ground after striking a depression on the new Zionville-Fredericton highway, near Milton, at a rate of speed witness say was excessive. Stanley Fowler, 22, of Chatham, who was riding with him, is near death in the same hospital. A third occupant of the car, Irvin Cady, of Milton, escaped with minor injuries. The extent of Fowler's injuries, which were mostly internal, is not yet known.
