SAILINGS HELD UP
IN NEW YORK

Big Liners Are Unable to Coal
on Account of Harbor
Strike—Proceed to Halifax
for Bunker Load.

Halifax, N. S., Mar. 12.—Word reached the city today that the Mauretania, sailing from New York tomorrow, would probably call at New York for coal, owing to the strike at Halifax. The Caronia of the Cunard line is expected in port on Friday for the same purpose. The liner Caronia, which was to have sailed on Monday, was expected to get away today, stopping at Halifax for coal.

The Mauretania was scheduled to sail today, but will not depart until tomorrow. The Lapland, which was due to leave for Liverpool last Saturday, and the French liner Niagara, which were to have gone yesterday, are expected to clear today. The Adriatic's sailing time has been changed from March 15 to March 16, because of the delay to the Lapland.

Take Over Barrington Lights.

Beginning with the first of next month the lights and other property of the Marine and Fisheries Department along the Nova Scotia coast as far as Barrington, will be placed under the control of the New Brunswick agency. The various stations will all be thoroughly repaired and renovated.

Addition to Local Fleet.

The Dominion Government steamer Laurentine will be added to the service of the local division of the Department of Marine and Fisheries, as the added scope of the New Brunswick agency makes such a move imperative.

The Laurentine is at present in dry dock at Halifax, and will come to the city immediately when released, probably this week.

Four-Master Ashore.

Word has been received at Boston that the four-master schooner Madelyn Shirley Lord is ashore at Ponce, Puerto Rico and in danger of being wrecked. The vessel left Fort de France, Martinique, on March 2, for Bordeaux with a cargo of rum. The schooner was under orders to put into Ponce for new sails.

The Madelyn Shirley Lord was formerly the Julia Loft, and was built at New York City in 1917. She is commanded by Captain Cox, of Everett, and has a crew of fifteen men.

Due Saturday.

The S. S. Carib is expected at this port Saturday with a large cargo of raw sugar from San Pedro for the sugar refineries.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a bill will be presented for enactment at the next Session of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, to amend Chapter 92 of the Acts of the said Legislative Assembly passed in 1911:

(1) By erasing the names of the charter members mentioned in page one (1) and substituting therefore, the names of five (5) other persons as charter members.

(2) By substituting for the Provisional Directors mentioned in Section Eight (8) of said Act, the names of the five (5) persons so to be substituted.

(3) By incorporating in the said Act the Provisions of the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, so far as the same may be consistent therewith.
