

AROUND WORLD'S PORTS

St. John's Harbored 52 Lame Ducks

St. John's, Nfld., Feb. 13.—This port has been a haven of refuge for more lame ducks among trans-Atlantic shipping in the past year than ever before.

The fact that American boats comprised more than half the total number was attributed by marine observers to defects in construction and improper handling.

Wooden ships have had manifold troubles. One of them, the Fern, was built in the Southern States and was proceeding to England with a cargo of lumber when she went ashore on the coast.
