To the Editor of the Telegraph: Sir,-The university of King's College again stands at the parting of the ways. The unexpected has happened. It is only three years since the proposed federation of the university with that of Dalhousie met defeat at the hands of those who favored an effort at reorganization on existing lines, and only two years since that reorganization was completed.

In view of the results of Rev. S. Weston Jones' enthusiastic and persistent case, it is manifest that the Church of England people in the maritime provinces either cannot or will not contribute towards the support of a separate university. The authorities and those interested in King's College have once more an opportunity to decide whether the efficiency of the Church of England's divinity school should continue to be kept in a vain and frantic effort to secure in a vain attempt to social and church work.
