The Academy is under the control of the Governors of the University, and its Courses of study will be determined by the University Senate. The first is destained to give students a thorough preparation for College; the second provides a thorough elementary education for young men intending to enter some department of business. Special attention will be given to students wishing to study for the Grade B. Licence.

A commodious building has been erected for instruction in Manual Training, The department is now in successful operation.
