Principal A. E. Garvie, in the preface to his latest book, Studies in the Inner Life of Jesus (Hodder and Stoughton, London, U.C. Tract Society, Toronto, 542 pages, \$1.75 net), tells that his interest in the subject dates back to a time when he was engaged in business, devoting his leisure to study and Christian work in the slums of Glasgow. During the ten years of his Scottish pastorate, and after he became a professor, it continued to engage his earnest thought. The book offers, therefore, the fruits of patient inquiry and diligent research. And in it no one will fail to find help who wishes to understand more fully the Life of lives. Dr. Garvie's volume is to other Lives of Christ, what the Gospel of John is to the Synoptics. It makes little of the outward circumstances and conditions, the environment and ideals which form "the scenery, the upholstery and drapery of the life of Jesus", and devotes itself to the revelation which Jesus gives of His own heart and mind and will in His words and works. Twenty-four studies, beginning with the Eternal Word and closing with the Risen Lord and the Living Christ, are followed by two which gather up the teaching of those going before as to the Person of Jesus.

A well read, modern-minded man, a clear thinker, with a keen sense of what tells, and with a true pastor's heart, Rev. P. Wilson, M.A. has given ministers and theological students, and the general reader who wants to think clearly and to purpose, a readable and

valuable book, in, The Great Salvation : A Gospel for the Day (Oliphant, Anderson & Ferrier, Edinburgh, 281 pages, \$1.25 net). "In untechnical language I have endeavored to set forth man's exceeding need of salvation and God's exceeding grace in supplying that need "-is the author's intimation; and his endeavor is made good. The two chapters on Salvation as a Sevenfold Deliverance, and the three on The Saving One, are the core of the discussion, whilst the three closing chapters, on issues of salvation affecting the life which now is and that which is to come, are fresh and timely. Salvation is the central theme of revelation, and the one greatest thing to every man upon the earth. What it is, therefore, and how it is to be had, and what it will do for men,-these topics of the book are of undying interest.

Three more goodly volumes have been issued of Dr. Alexander Maclaren's, Expositions of Holy Scripture (Hodder & Stoughton, London, U.C. Tract Society, Toronto, \$1.25 the volume). These volumes will be of special use at the present time to the minister and Sabbath School teacher, covering as they do the Gospel of John, from which the International Lessons for the current half year are taken. Dr. Maclaren is the ideal expositor for this wonderful Gospel. With his sureness and depth of insight, his clearness and beauty of expression, and his unsurpassed skill in arrangement, he shows the student unerringly how to win from the pages written by the beloved disciple rich spoils of intellectual and spiritual gain.
