apprehension of dangers; and nothing can be of more importance, than to convince our Colonies that they will be protected. Behold the confequences of this dangerous confidence, in the cafe of a neighbouring people, who overlooked and difregarded their enemies. Why is it neceffary that nations, in order to preferve peace, should ruin themselves in preparations of defence? Let this dreadful policy be reprobated by every country !

It is for the purpole of embracing the various objects announced in their Report, that your Committee propoles a Decree, as the most proper to fulfil your engagements without imprudence, to change the ancient fystem without danger, and to avoid a war without exhibiting any fymptoms of weaknefs.

The Decree proposed by M. Mirabeau, underwent confiderable discuffion and change. It was finally decreed on Thursday the 26th of August, and is as follows;
