

Bunny Ahearne strikes again

Glendon hockey trip called off

President of the International Ice Hockey Federation, Bunny Ahearne, has blocked Glendon's inter-college hockey team from a five-game tour in Holland. The team, the Glendon Gophers, were originally scheduled to leave

tomorrow. Ahearne said the Dutch did not go through proper channels in inviting the Glendon team. Team representative Andy Raven said, "the regulations and stipulations set by Ahearne are unfounded." He said two other Canadian teams who had

proceeded according to Ahearne's rules had also been told their trips were off. Raven says if the team goes anyway, the Dutch hockey players will be barred from international hockey. He said he thought Ahearne had it in for Canada since they pulled out of world hockey competition. He also said Ahearne has a hang-up about amateur-professional status. Dutch hockey officials, the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association, and the Toronto media are backing the Glendon team's stand. Financial backing, with \$1,000 from York, \$150 from the Glendon student union, and \$150 from the Glendon athletic council meant \$150 cost for each of the 14 players. They were given reduced air fares by KLM and had billeting arrangements for their stay in Holland. Raven, top scorer last year for the Dutch league, had arranged the exchange.

Feb. carnival has handbook

Council of the York Student Federation plans to put out a handbook for this year's winter carnival planned for February. The handbook would be free but has 75 to 90 percent advertising. CYSF president Mike Fletcher says the book will probably cost about \$3,000 to put out and will bring about \$1,500 for the publishers, Shay and Associates. CYSF is presently involved with a lawsuit against George Moore of Colonial Imports after the student handbook failed to appear.

The players included Paul Janacki (Stong), Harry Posner (Vanier), Mike Thomas (Stong), Les Mudwiler, Al Hawrelak and Gunnar Saulitis.
