

Head Quarters Quebec  
19<sup>th</sup> March 1814.

Sir,

I beg leave to inform you that Tecumseh's Sister with all the Indian Chiefs from the Western Nations (excepting Two who are at present sick with the small Pox) have set out to-day on their return to Montreal, where it is His Excellency's wish they should remain a few days to rest themselves, or until they can be joined with their two sick Brethren, if their recovery is not protracted beyond a week or ten days: -
