Camp Borden	1-3-45		<p>0800 hours, ceiling and visibility unlimited. Flying washed in at 0830 hours, washed out at 1330 hours due to Wings Parade. Total flying time 195.55 hours. No night flying.</p> <p>This afternoon Course 118 was presented with their flying badges on the Parade Ground by Group Captain J.B. Harvey. The course although only amounting to 28 in number presented a very smart appearance on parade. The presentation of 'Wings' to W/L C.D. Perkins <u>DFC</u> was of particular interest as he has a distinguished record in the RCAF as an Air Gunner and has now realized his greatest ambition in <u>being</u> awarded his Pilot's flying badge. F/O S.R. Gillanders formerly a Captain in the Royal Signal Corps was another who has given his country long and distinguished service. The intake for Course 118 was as follows: 3 RCAF, <u>26</u> RAF, 9 RCAF, and 1 RNZAF, giving a total of 39. The wastage was as follows: 10 RAF, and 1 RNZAF, giving a total of 11. There were a total of 28 graduates in all:- 3 RCAF, 16 RAF, and 9 RCAF.
