A deputation representing 700 odd post employees, was led by the Liberal leader. (Mr. Keir Gladstone for Mr. H. C. Campbell-Bannerman)

- Mrs. Kuij, Secy. - Spokesman said they did not ask the Post to do anything but carry out the resolution it had been passed by the House.

- here in Goubran it had been stipulated that post wages would

be reduced from 7d an hr or 20s a week to 48 hrs. — when the Post however, dealt with its employees it had no fair-wage clause. Unrest, with the result that they, the men who worked extra & rode miles the contractors' men frequently under more arduous conditions only got 18s to 20s a wk for 48 hrs. Subsequent events had made the position of the Post still more untenable.

In March 1896 the Govt moved a resolution, in view of the liberal post then in power, - declaring that the post should be the model employer - the Govt was the post over the worst employer in the city, paying the lowest wages & extracting the hardest work setting aside any man they found fit old. — After when various labor questions were before the Labor Committee in 1894, the minority - rep't recommended the post to immediately improve the condition of the post worker raising his wages to a minimum of 29s per week. — today even the deputation was better off. — The reply of the permanent official to all this was that the post employee had contract employment, but that was not true as its discharge
