- 4. If the lease is terminated within the period of ten years, the Department to pay applicant one-tenth of the cost of fence for each unexpired year of the term of ten years
- 5. Applicant to have the right, if desired, of building sheds, snow-breaks &c., and establishing a feeding-camp, where necessary and removing same at expiration of the lease
- 6. Applicant to pay for the above mentioned privileges \$1.25 per head per annum for all cattle grazing on said area "calves or cattle under one year of age not included", the minimum rental after the first year not to be less than \$6,000.00-
- 7. No charge to be made for grazing privileges for a sufficient number of horses to manage the cattle grazing on the area.

J.Cowdry, of Macleod, Alberta, makes the following proposition for leasing of the aforesaid privileges: To fence the Reserve in and to pay the Indians \$4,000.00 yearly for grazing an average number of 4 500 head per annum and at the end of ten years the fence to become the property of the Indians. The grazing privileges to be subject to cancellation on two years' notice and should the lease be cancelled before the end of ten years, the Department to re-imburse applicant a proportionate next thereof.

Whatever terms the Indians agree upon should be embodied in the form of a resolution, authorizing the granting of permission accordingly.

As to disposition of rental received, I may say that the Department would be willing to distribute one half of the rental received im cash each year to the Indians, the other half being funded for the benefit of the Band.

Any rights granted or which may be granted in connection with the lease of coal lands on the Reserve to be duly reserved.
