barristers in our country, I cannot be too grateful to the Benchers of the Law Society of Upper Canada for the honour they have done his son in conferring on him the degree of Barrister-at-Law, and the distinction of Honorary Bencher of the Law Society. I know that nothing could have afforded my father more in the way of happiness than to have had my name find a place along with his on the long and honourable roll of members of the legal profession of Ontario.
