32. The Secretary submitted recommendations to Council for certain appointments.

33. The Cabinet, after discussion, approved the following appointments; Orders in Council to be passed accordingly:

(a) T.W.L. MacDermot, Esquire, to be High Commissioner for Canada in the Union of South Africa;

(b) Edmond Turcotte, Esquire, to be Consul General of Canada in Caracas, Venezuela;

(c) Douglas S. Cole, Esquire, to be Consul General of Canada in Chicago;

(d) John Rayner, Esquire, to be an Assistant Grain Commissioner, at a salary of \$7,500 per annum.
