township, Parry Sound District, 3 miles
north-west of Parry Sound, the nearest
shipping point. Nearest bank at Colling-
wood. Settled in 1867. It contains Epis-
copal, Methodist and Presbyterian churches,
and common school, and ships lumber.
Stage to Parry Sound once a week, fare 25c.
Mail weekly. Robert Blair, postmaster.

CARLINGFORD. A village in Ful-
larton township, Perth County, 10 miles
west of Stratford, the county seat and near-
est bank location, and 7 south-west of
Sebringville, on the B & G line G T Ry, its
nearest railway point. It contains a Metho-
dist church and common school, and ships
grain and produce. Population, 120. Mail
tri-weekly. Mrs S J Dunlop, postmaster.

creek (which furnishes power) in East Flam-
boro' township, Wentworth County, 12 miles
north-west of Hamilton, the county seat and
nearest banking point, and 9 south of
Schaw, on the C V line O div C P Ry, its
nearest railway station. It contains a
Methodist church and 2 public schools, and
ships grain and wood. It is on the daily
stage route from Hamilton to Lowville.
Population, 150. Telegraph, GNW. Mail
daily. Mrs Regula Koella, postmaster.
