

If the alfalfa is cut before these small shoots start at all the second growth will be slow in starting and will, as a result, take considerably longer to make a second cut than

when the first crop is cut just as these new shoots appear in the crowns. If, on the other hand, these shoots have started and made

sufficient growth to be cut off by the mower, the second cut will be even more delayed. The proper time to cut, therefore, is just when the shoots of new growth are first noticeable at the crowns.

The length of time the hay should be left in the swath will depend both on the heaviness of the crop and the weather at cutting time.
