And then, on motion of Mr. Planté, seconded by Mr. Berthelot, The House adjourned.

A Message from the Legislative Council by Mr. Smith, Master in Chancery.

" Legislative Council, Saturday, 26th January, 1805."

ORDERED, That the Master in Chancery, do go down to the Assembly and acquaint that House, that the Legislative Council have passed the Bill, intituled, "An Act surther to continue "for a limited time, An Act passed in the forty-third year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for the betater preservation of His Majesty's Government as by Law "happily established in this Province," without any amendment.

And also,

ORDERED, "That the Master in Chancery do go down to the Assembly, and acquaint that House, that the Legislative Council have passed the Bill, intituled, "An Ast to ratify and "confirm the Provisional Articles of Agreement entered into by the respective Commissioners of this Province and of Upper-Canada, at Montreal, on the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and four, relative to duties, and for carrying the same into effect; and also surther to continue An Ast passed in the thirty-seventh year of His Majesty's reign," without any amendment.

And then he withdrew.
