SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST LAND REGULATIONS.
THE sole owner of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions:
Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house, as required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
In certain districts, a homesteader, in good standing, may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$500 per acre.
Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.
A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in fertile districts. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200.
The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

Peking, Dec. 14.—(Correspondence of The Associated Press)—Yuan Kuo-ting, the eldest son of Emperor Yuan Shikai, recently had an audience with Ti Yen, the well known Buddhist monk, who has been holding religious services in Peking. Details of this meeting have been widely reported in the Chinese press and are causing much comment because of political significance.
The president's son is reported to have told the monk that for several years he suffered an illness which compelled him to give up all aspirations for worldly affairs, and to devote himself to the study of Buddhist writings, but as soon as he grasped the essential principles of these sacred teachings, he found his health greatly improved.
Ti Yen replied that a man's earthly existence is anything but real. "However," he continued, "as your highness occupies such a position that some day you will have the responsibility of the whole nation on your shoulders, it is my highest hope that your highness will take care of your health so as to enable you to serve your country in the coming days. 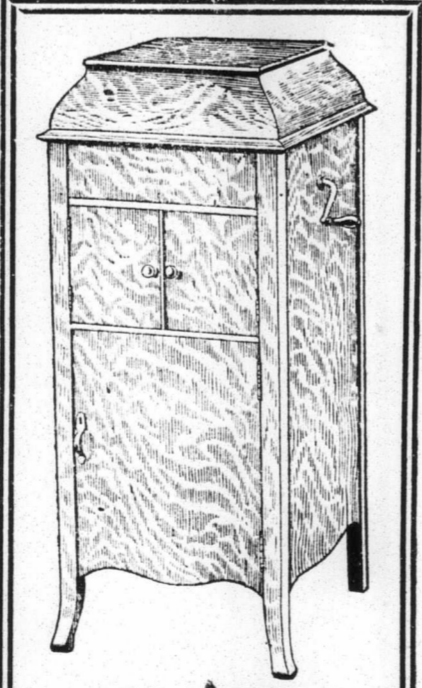
