PORTUGUESE DEFEAT HUNS

Huns Put to Flight in German East Africa, With Heavy Losses

Lisbon, via Paris, Oct. 30.—11.15 p.m.—(Delayed)—Portuguese troops in German East Africa have defeated the German forces, captured Newala and taken a large quantity of guns and other war material, says to-day's war office announcement. The text reads: "Portuguese troops in East Africa after advancing 105 miles defeated the enemy after a short struggle on October 26, and took Newala. The enemy retreated precipitately. The Portuguese forces captured a large quantity of bombs, dynamite, guns and war material. Their losses were light."

COAL GOES UP IN NEW YORK

By Courier Leased Wire. New York, Oct. 31.—The high cost of keeping warm took another jump here to-day. Householders in New York city learned that coal in the domestic sizes, egg and nut, now brings \$12 a ton. Dealers attribute the increase to the tremendous consumption of coal in factories throughout the country which are through out the night to fill war and other orders; to the natural increase of coal orders at this time of year; to the inability of railroads, because of a shortage of equipment, to haul all the coal that is ordered, and to the large increases in shipments of coal to other countries, chiefly Canada. There is no shortage, it is said, of the coal supply.

There were 49 Americans in the crew of the Marina. First reports of her sinking said only 34 members of her crew had been brought to shore. Mr. Frost sent word yesterday to the American embassy at London that the Marina had been continued on page four.

GERMANY METES OUT HARD TREATMENT TO RUSS PRISONERS

Under Plea of Reprisals, Captives in Hun Prison Camps are Submitted to Fresh Cruelties and Indignities

Berlin, Oct. 31.—(By wireless to Sayville)—Measures of reprisal upon Russian prisoners have been ordered by the German Government pending the Russian Government's acceptance of German demands for improved treatment of German prisoners of war in Russia, according to the semi-official North German Gazette.

This newspaper states that the German Government asked of the Russian Government that it put an end to conditions which were causing suffering to German prisoners of war, and that the period given by the German Government for compliance having elapsed without a satisfactory answer from Russia, the German Government has ordered reprisals. To this end, it is stated, a number of officers belonging to crack Russian regiments have been transferred to a special camp where discipline is especially severe, and where they will remain until the Russian Government complies with the German request.

VOTE OF AUSTRALIAN SOLDIERS MAY CHANGE CONSCRIPTION ISSUE
