WASHINGTON WIRINGS.
Washington, D. C., Dec. 31.—Judge Mc-Comas tu-day over-ruled the demurrers filed by the attorneys of Captain Howgate to three indictments returned by the grand jury. Capt. Howgate was then arraigned and pleated not guilty, but appended a further plea that the indictment was not found within three years after the alleged offense therein charged was committed. The question as to whether the indictments were barred by the statute of limitations was thereupon argued.
