NATURAL GAS

Aylmer, Oct. 17—A proposition has been made to the town by the Thames Valley Oil. & Gas Company, covering a supply of natural gas for heating and lighting purposes. The company applies for a thirty year franchise at a rate not to exceed thirty cents per thousand feet.

The company is understood to be composed of Pittsburg, Detroit and Tillsonburg capitalists, and the latter place is to be supplied at the same rates as Aylmer. The idea is to drill a number of wells at a point about midway between the two towns and pipe the gas in both directions. The smaller places along 'the gas main lines would also be supplied, it is understood.
