

Legal Decisions 1. Any person who takes a paper reg-ularly from the Post Office-whether dir-ected to his name or another's or whether he has subscribed or not-is responsible for the payment. 2. If a person orders his paper discon-tinued, he must pay up all arrearages, or the publisher may continue to seed it unti-payment is made, and collect the whol-mount, whether the paper is taken from the office or not.

the office or not. 3. The courts have decided that refus-ing to take newspapers and periodicals from the Post Office, or removing and leaving them uncalled for is prima facis evidence of intentional fraud.
