A most appalling automobile accident occurred at Cacinelle, about 100 miles distant from Naples, Thursday, five men being killed. The motor car, which was going at a high speed, ran into a rock and was demolished. Among the killed was Prince Prieria, member of the Italian nobility, and related to the Spanish Royal house on account of whose death the aristocracy of the whole of lower Italy will be in mourning.

A special to the Atlantic Journal from Jasper, Fla., says W. W. Barton, a carpenter, shot and almost instantly killed his wife, three children and himself at his home there Wednesday night. One

victim, a child five years old, survived long enough to tell that Barton did the killing. The shots were heard about ten o'clock last night but no attention was paid to the matter until early yesterday, when neighbors discovered Barton's body lying on the front porch, and that of his wife on the back porch. The children were found in a bedroom, the pistol having been held close to the mouth in each instance and the faces were powder marked.

Replying to Mr. Cleland's question relating to the two hundred and fifty Scotchmen with whom it was alleged Grand Trunk Pacific contractors had broken an agreement to provide work at Portage La Prairie, Mr. Winston Churchill, in the House of Commons, pointed out that instructions were given to the local foremen immediately the complaint was made to employ the men, even if they were not needed. The men also were immediately on arrival taken to camps and fed. Under the circumstances the government saw no necessity to take any action.

Chun Ah Sung, a Christian Chinese student at Mount Union College, Alliance, Ohio is unable to enter Canada at the border be-

cause of stringent immigration laws. He was on his way to attend an international Y. M. C. A. students' conference at Niagara-on-the-lake, Ont. His passport have been sent to Ottawa, where the Canadian authorities may permit him to visit Canada for a short period without paying the prohibitive head tax.

A most unusual court case came up in Glace Bay, C. B. last week. Jacobson, an ex-tabbie, who is conducting a dry goods business there, had a Newfoundland merchant named Myers capiased for \$75. Some weeks ago Jacobson recommended to the notice of Myers, who was then a widower, a handsome young Jewish lady of Sydney named Tomavetsky. Myers, a Jew also, came over from Newfoundland, pressed his suit and won the lady. Jacobson claims the sum of \$75 for his alleged trouble and expense in the matter, hence the capias.
