Washington, D.C., April 25-A new and wide vista for extension of communication by radio, land alphabet by Gen. George O. Squier the Chief Signal Officer of the army at the annual meeting here of the National Academy of Science.

The new alphabet, hailed as the communication in many years, is 2.65 times faster than the international Morse code now universally latter, which was invented eighty years ago . The Morse code, Gen Squier said, is entirely out of date and unsuited to telegraphy as known and practised to-day.
