

In Janurary, 1663, there was a series of shocks extending over a period of several days. The houses rocked violently, walls were cracked and chimneys were toppled over. Men women and children ran out into the streets and open places. In eastern Canada the effects of this earthquake were even more severer In Quebec two hills were thrown down, and formed a point of land. which extended far out into the St. Lawrence River. This earthquake extended to New York and Pennsylvania. Then there were slight earthquake shocks in 1665, 1668, 1669, 1677, 1705 and 1720.
