#### EXPECT AGREEMENT.

The trade negotiators go to Washngton in the confident expectation of eaching an agreement with President Caft and Secretary Knox that will be nutually beneficial to both countries n respect to removing unnecessary atural products and possibly also of a ach country can profitably purchase rom the other and the admission of which at a lower rate of duty in some ases and duty free in other cases yould not seriously injure any large

The general scope of the contemlated agreement was pretty well outned at the preliminary conference ere last November and each side has ow a pretty clear and frank unerstanding as to the limits within hich agreement is possible.

### GET DOWN TO DETAILS.

The negotiators will be able to get own at once to the discussion of deails on Monday in Washington. No lefinite statement as to the probable ither Messrs. Fielding or Paterson rior to their departure, and naturlly all details will be guarded with he closet secrecy until the agreenent is ready to be placed before Pariament for ratification. It is known owever, that, while the Canadian linisters have not plenipotentiary owers to finally conclude any agreenent, they have practically the fullst authority from their colleagues guarantee the carrying out by anada of any proposals they may gree to with the American negotiaors. The main idea underlying the egotiations from the Canadian standoint will be ecuring of freer access or Canadian natural products paricularly agricultural products to the \merican market. It is not expectd that there will be any large neasure, of reciprocity secured

MAY LAST TEN DAYS. The negotiations at Washington vill probably last for ten days or so. t is possible that before a final agreenent is reached Messrs.
