For the information of the Public it is notified that the regulations made under the War Measures Act, on the 23rd January last, providing that, as and from the said date the sale of Potatoes and other like vegetables within this Dominion shall be by weight instead of by measure, is still in force. For general guidance, the following extract from the Weights and Measures Act is published:

- 23 (1) In contracts for the sale and delivery of any of the undermentioned articles, the bushel shall be determined by weighing, unless a bushel by measure is specially agreed upon; and the weight equivalent to a bushel shall be as follows: Wheat, Pease, Beans, Potatoes and Clover Seed, sixty pounds.
- Eye, Indian Corn and Flaxseed, fifty-six pounds.
- Turnips, Carrots, Beet and Onions, fifty pounds.
- Barley, Buckwheat and Timothy Seed, forty-eight pounds.
- Hemp Seed, forty-four pounds.
- Parsnips and Castor Beans, forty pounds.
- Oats, thirty-four pounds.
- Blue Grass Seed, fourteen pounds.

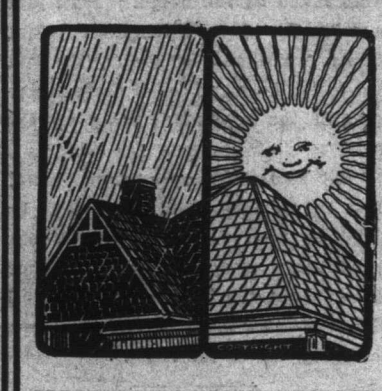
