Pancho Villa Defeats Goldstein.

NEW YORK BANTAMWEIGHT GETS GOOD BEATING FROM FLY-WEIGHT TITLE HOLDER.

NEW YORK, Nov. 16.—Pancho Villa, Filipino, holder of the American flyweight championship, went out of his class to-night and defeated Abe Goldstein, New York bantamweight, in a 15-round contest at Madison Square Garden. He received the judges' decision after decisively outpointing and outpunching his heavier rival. Villa was the aggressor throughout the first three rounds. Sparring with cat-like grace he jabbed at Goldstein steadily and landed several hard lefts to the body. He drew blood from his opponent's nose in the second round. The pace quickened in the third round and both exchanged hard body blows. Goldstein seemed content to stay on the defensive.

Villa had the better of a rapid-fire exchange in the fourth, landing several slashing lefts to Goldstein's head and body. Goldstein shook Villa with two left hooks to the jaw in the fifth after a slow session of sparring. The Filipino scored with both fists repeatedly in the sixth as he carried the fight to Goldstein who had landed few telling blows so far. Villa had the better of the fight all the way through and at the end of the 15th round was hammering away with both hands after having driven Goldstein all over the ring with lefts to the face and having shaken him with a right hook to the chin.

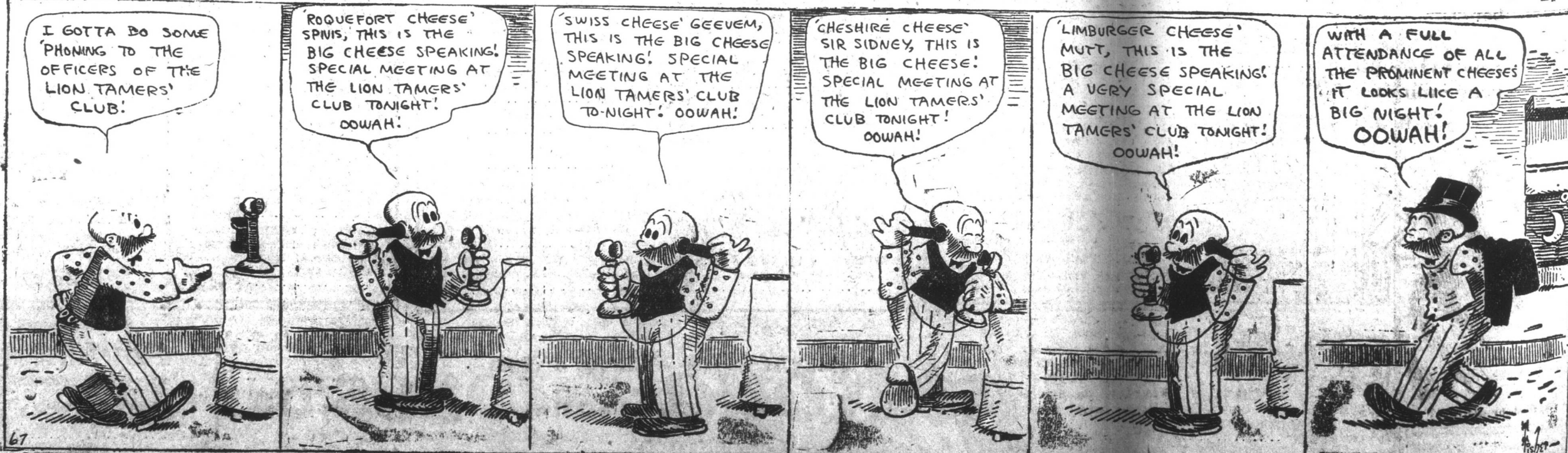

Ten Drowned in Fifteen Mile Lake.

SEARCH PARTIES FOUND ONLY FLOATING BAGGAGE AND CLOTHING.

QUEBEC, Nov. 16.—(Canadian Press)—The accident on Fifteen Mile Lake, near Shelter Bay, on the north shore of the St. Lawrence, when a speed gasoline boat went through the ice on Monday night, resulted in the loss of ten lives, among whom were a doctor and a woman, according to details reaching here this morning. At the present time the Ontario Paper Company, which owns the large timber limits at Shelter Bay, has a party of men working with grappling irons and a diver, seeking to recover the bodies. Nothing has yet been found of the boat or its passengers.

Although a search was made all around the lake on land the only thing seen was floating baggage.

According to details reaching this city, the motorboat left the "six mile portage" on Sunday afternoon with a party of ten, after having stopped at a camp at the foot of the lake, for the priest, Rev. Father Tortellier, to say Mass.

The following day was windy, but no ice had been encountered on the lake previously, the party decided to leave on Monday night for the head of the lake, fifteen miles away.

On the following morning, Tuesday, a tugboat and scow, belonging to the Ontario Paper Company struck ice in the middle of the lake, but broke through. On reaching the head of the lake, however, there was no sign that the speed boat had arrived with its ten passengers, so a search party was immediately sent back to the middle of the lake and there it was found that the gasoline launch had struck ice.

The land all around the lake was searched thoroughly, but the only trace of boat or passengers found was floating baggage and clothing. It is certain that the ten passengers perished and indications are that the boat must have tried in several places to get out of the ice before sinking.

Dr. Romeo Vezina, of Matana, and Rev. Father Tortellier, of Penticost, are the only two victims whose names it has been possible to ascertain up to the present, but the homes of the others are given as follows: One from St. Raymond County, Portneuf, one from Tadoussac, one from Bic, a man and his wife from Escoumain, and one or two from Quebec.

Navigating the Life Ship.

In bad weather, when there are heavy fogs and storms at sea, the navigator is obliged to take his bearings frequently to know where he is. If he doesn't do this, he cannot intelligently direct his course, and is liable to wreck his ship by running into hidden rocks.

Every man is the navigator of a life ship, and if he doesn't early form the habit of taking his bearings, to find out where he is and whether he is going, he may, in middle life, find his ship stranded on the rock of failure. If you would save yourself from shipwreck take your bearings frequently.

Capitalism Versus Communism.

It is hard to understand the mental make-up of those men who, in free states like Great Britain, Canada, and the American Republic, strive to impose upon their own countries the system of sovietism that exists in Russia. The present government of Russia was established in the same name of liberty, but it is a tyranny without a parallel in human history.

A striking comparison is made possible by the case of Trevor Maguire, tried for seditious utterances in Toronto on October 31. It was proved that Maguire said in a speech delivered at a public meeting in Queen's Park that, "in looking around this British Empire (vampire would be a better name), we find it has committed untold atrocities in India, Egypt and other countries, including Canada, and against Soviet Russia."

He was found guilty and recommended to the mercy of the court. A purely nominal sentence was im-

posed. Suppose Mr. Maguire, living in Russia, had given expression to similar seditious utterances, what would have been his sentence? In all probability it would have been death. Tens of thousands of the best Russian manhood and womanhood were put to death for saying much less against the Soviets. The policy of Lenin has been the extinction of the cultured and educated classes. A despotism tempered by assassination has been the reigning power of Russia for five years. And yet there are men in Canada who profess a preference for

that kind of government as one conducted on British lines. It is inconceivable. The point we desire to make is extreme leniency of what the states call Capitalistic rule, and the extraordinary rigor and severity of the rule of the proletariat. If leniency is the goal to which we are struggling, it must be to it by the British system and the Russian method.—The Second.
