TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

WINE LIQUOR SEIZURE AT RING-SIDE.

JERSEY CITY, N.J., Sept. 11. Prohibition agents scored the first knockdown at Boyles thirty acres late today. As the gates for the Firpo-Wills encounter opened sixty men led by G. Q. Merrick, Divisional Chief for New York and New Jersey, seized several hundred cases of whiskey, five hundred gallons of beer and made a number of arrests. One of the seizures was a speakeasy making for the Jersey shore in the vicinity of the arena. About were 250 cases of whiskey which were seized. Merrick declared that the liquor was intended for sale to the fight fans in the big bowl at Boyles thirty acres to-night.

FIGHTING IN CHINA.

SHANGHAI, Sept. 11. Desperate attempts of Kiangsu General to check the advance of Chekiang troops upon Iking, a town about 100 miles to the westward of Shanghai near Tai Lake took the bulk of the interest in China's civil war away from the nearby battlefronts. The nearest sectors were not wholly without action, however. Observers were turned to light from Kwangtu in the railway sector and were told of a sizeable attack on the night by Kiangsu forces which the Chekiang soldiers defending Shanghai repulsed. Fighting in the Luhe sector northwest of the city was reported by observers to be without special features. The Chekiang army started a counter attack in Kwangtu sector to-day, trying once more to effect the capture of Ashing. The west Tai Lake front Chekiang troops were reported by their headquarters at Lunghwa to have made progress through the hilly country south of this.

GREAT BRITAIN'S NAVAL BOMB.

Geneva, Sept. 11. Great Britain dramatically dropped a naval bomb into the Geneva Conference today and the new Anglo-French Entente was appraised by many as approaching the character of an out and out alliance when Sir Cecil Hurst, the eminent jurist and British delegate, declared Great Britain's address to accept compulsory arbitration, provided that would not be brought into court because of some act of her navy performed in attempting to maintain or restore peace. This declaration has set Geneva thinking a good deal more than anything since Premier MacDonald and Herriot committed themselves in principle to the settlement of any and all disputes by obligatory arbitration by some world tribunal or tribunals.

Schooner Picked up by Arrowmore

FIELD SCHOONER GEORGE W. EYRE TOWED TO ST. PIERRE BY C. G. S. ARRANMORE.

After being buffeted about in a raging wind and a heavy sea for several days the Newfoundland schooner George W. Eyre, in command of Captain Rheanard, was picked up in a crippled condition near Fortune Bay, Newfoundland Sept. 1st and towed to St. Pierre by the Canadian Government steamer Arranmore, Capt. Rhude.

Leaving North Sydney on the day of the big storm with a cargo of coal for St. Pierre, the Eyre had not gone far before she was overtaken by the storm and buffeted around in the heavy seas which quickly rose after the storm broke. Through the manner in which she was navigated she managed to weather the gale for several hours, but was finally rendered helpless by having a portion of her sails carried away by the wind. She arrived off Fortune in a crippled condition and was picked up by the Arranmore and towed to her destination at the French Colony.

The Arranmore has since returned to North Sydney after having completed her trip to Fortune Bay and Placentia Bay where she had been rescuing four buoys which went adrift from their moorings at the entrance of the St. Lawrence River several weeks ago. These four buoys were picked up as well as several others which had broke loose since. After replenishing her bunkers at North Sydney, the Arranmore will return to Halifax.

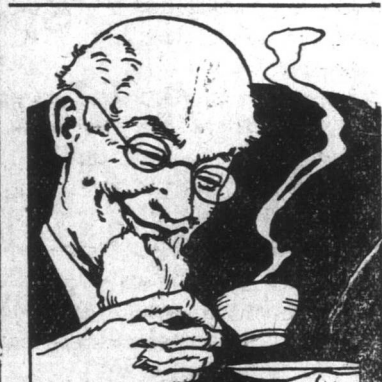
