ONE WAY TO SUCCESS.—One of the largest and most successful shoe manufacturers of Lynn worked seven years upon his seat to get a capital of \$1,135, with which he commenced business. His earnings during these years were \$5 a week—\$260 a year. He paid \$2 a week for board, and make \$1 pay all other expenses, thus saving \$104 each year, which with the interest added and small amounts gained in trade, amounted in seven years to the sum above named. The first year in business be cleared \$500, the second \$1,000 and the third \$2,000 — all the time outting his own shoes, and keeping his personal expense down to the old sum—\$3 per week. As his means increased his operations enlarged, and for several years past he has done a very large and successful business, and is known as one of the best and most liberal of our citizens, giving large sums to charitable purposes. During the year 1867 he did a business of \$300,000, the profits on which were \$40,000 and the total loss by bad debt s, one case of boots, worth \$150.—Lynn Transcript.

An editor in Germany has been heavily fined for selling space in his editorial columns to M. Blanc, of the Homburg gambling hell. M. Blanc has filled the space he has bought with startling accounts of the heavy losses which the bank was reported to have sustained; these accounts were, of course, entirely fictitious, and only destined to attract the gudgeons to Homburg.

A Queen Buried with all her Personal

A QUEEN BURIED WITH ALL HER PERSONAL A QUEEN BURILD WITH ALLIER PRISSONAL EFFECTS.— A Very strange account has reached us from Madagascar, says the Calcutta Englishman, of the burial of the late Queen. The body was swathed in nearly 500 silk lambas, in the folds of which twenty gold watches, one hundred gold chains, rings, brooches, bracelets, and other jewellery, together with five hundred gold coins, were rolled. All the presents which she had received from the Queen and the Emperor of the French were buried with her, and all her furniture and personal effects.
