

CLOSING DAY

Or the Turf Association's Spring Meeting.

Fair Weather, a Good Track and Large Attendance.

Four Races on the Card and Plenty of Sport—A Successful Windup.

Thousands of more people who spent Thursday afternoon... Queen's Park witnessed some fine races. It was the third and last day of the London Turf Association's spring meeting, and it was a success in every sense of the word.

For the special race, trotting, mile heats, there were four entries—John L. Lady Rooker, Texas Jack and Dick Smith. In the first heat the struggle for first place between Dick Smith and John L. was very exciting.

The third heat was also an interesting one. The four horses kept well together until the last lap, when John L. broke ahead and Lady Rooker was second.

For the 2:30 trotting, mile heats, best three in five, purse \$300 divided, Mamie S., Canada Southern, Jun., Pete Curran and Little Jake were entered.

The fifth heat was a good one. Pete broke during the first half; he caught up well, but broke again on the home stretch and lost the heat.

At the quarter pole Canada Southern's cart went to pieces. The race was close for first place between Mamie S. and Pete Curran. Both trotted admirably.

The judges reconsidered the case of the latter horses, and as the accident was purely accidental, allowed them to enter in the second heat.

The second heat was more interesting. The horses keeping nearest together, Jim Berry had the lead for nearly half a mile. Colonel was some distance behind, and around him clustered the other three.

This closed a successful three days' meeting, and the Turf Association is now glad that it decided to hold a series of races instead of discontinuing the business of the association.
