A BRAVE ACT

P. C. Bob Black Stops a Furious Runaway on Dundas Street - Was Dragged Considerable Distance.

In some manner it succeeded in freeing itself of its bridle. It then took fright. and ran up Wellington street to the C. P. R., where it turned, and continued its dash down Richmond street. When nearing Dundas street P. C. Black saw it coming, and hastened toward it. Seeing the absence of the bridle, he endeavored to catch the animal by the nose, but only reached it in time to grasp it by the mare. The horse swerved and turned west on Dundas street. P. C. Black retained his hold on mane, and endeavored to grasp the animal's nose, but was unable to do so. At the corner of Talbot street the wagon struck a pile of earth thrown up from an excavation in the street, and it tipped over. The horse continued to run about a quarter of a block further, when P. C. Black succeeded in stopping it, aided possibly by the partial shutting off of its wind by the twisting of its collar consequent upon the upsetting of the rig.
