the Lake Erie fishing industry still in a rather chaotic condition as a result of the extremely low prices paid for fish, has the minister given consideration to stabilizing the price through the federal stabilization board? If so, when may we expect an announcement on the decision made?

Hon. H. J. Robichaud (Minister of Fisheries): Representations have been made by the industry, and the officials of the fisheries prices support board are now completing an investigation. They are expected to report to the board very shortly.

## B.C. SALMON-REQUEST FOR REPORT ON NEGOTIATIONS WITH U.S.

On the orders of the day:

Mr. Frank Howard (Skeena): I should like to direct a question to the Minister of Fisheries, and I ask it now inasmuch as tomorrow in Seattle, Washington, another meeting will open relating to problems of joint concern to Canada and the United States. I ask the minister whether any proposal has been made to the United States that Canada will desist from salmon net fishing operations on Juan de Fuca strait if the United States will cease and desist from net fishing British Columbia bound salmon through Alaska waters.

Hon. H. J. Robichaud (Minister of Fisheries): The position being taken by Canada is well known. It will be the same position that was taken in Ottawa in February and at the previous meeting which was held in Washington last fall.

Mr. Howard: I wonder if the minister would mind answering the question I put to him, namely, did Canada offer to cease net salmon fishing in Juan de Fuca strait in return for the United States ceasing fishing home bound British Columbia salmon in Alaskan waters?

Mr. Robichaud: The details of the position taken by Canada will be known at the meeting that will open tomorrow in Seattle. I have nothing to add to what was reported following the meeting held in Ottawa early in February.
