Governesses; also, one French teacher, one Music master, one Italian teacher, one Singing master, one Drawing master, and one master in Painting. The scholastic year to be ten months. Candidates for admission to the school should be at least four-teen years of age, and they shall be expected to remain until they attain the age of eighteen years.

Scholarships shall be the gift of the Governors. Scholarships to be obtained by fair, honorable competition. The foundation pupils, or those who shall be awarded scholarships, to be at least eighteen in number, of whom twelve shall be the daughters of Protestant ministers in Canada, the preference to be at all times given to daughters of ministers of the aforesaid Presbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland, or, in case there should be formed a union of this Church with the Canada Presbyterian Church, the daughters of ministers of the thus united Body; the remaining six to be presented as hereinafter provided. And such foundation pupils will be entitled to a gratis board and education for the term of four years, or during the term necessary to send them out of the Seminary, fully competent to undertake the management of a school on their own account.

The competitive examination for scholarships to be conducted by the teachers of the school from examination questions prepared by the Governors, or a committee of them, who shall have power to call in one or more of the Professors of McGill College to their assistance, and for this purpose only, but principally by oral questions suited to the case. The answers should partly be in writing, but generally in oral answers, and the papers sent under seal to the Board of Governors or to the Committee, who shall decide upon their merits, judging also of the oral answers of the several candidates.

The course of study for the school shall include religious and moral instruction, based on the Bible.

The English and French languages, writing, arithmetic, use of the globes, history, elements of mathematics, horticulture, needle work, vocal and instrumental music, drawing and German if required.
