But, notwithstanding this, the mode of language is by no means unapplicable even to present times. For nature itself is not without her prophecies; which may to us in fome measure supplie the place of those, that were used to be delivered by the inspired seers of old. And it is undoubtedly one part of the divine intention, in the favorable events of providence towards a people, not merely to put them in possession of some present emolument, not merely to excite fome transient emotions of joy, but to inspire them with hope, as to their future prosperitie and encreasing grandeur. And, if there be any fuch natural prognostications now subsisting in our own favor, concerning which we might almost venture to affirm, that nothing but our own iniquities can defeat them; may we not then, humbly, as we most surely ought, but yet with some considerable degree of animating proprietie fay; "The Lord will " have
