The close was weak, but we are of the opinion that it is the time to buy wheat. The world's shipments are estimated to show over 7,000,000 bush.

Corn and Oats—There were very little for saie at the present prices. On any slight advances there was realizing, but they were both neglected. Corn in the visible increased 962,000 bush, and oats increased 12,000 bush.
