Uncle Sam's Prize-Spanish Warship Went Down, While En Route.

The Maria Teresa Left Calmanera Oct. 30 for New York in Tow, But She Had Been So Badly Battered That She Could Not Stand the Buffeting of the Waves.

Charleston, S.C., Nov. 5.—It is reported here that the cruiser Maria Teresa, recovered at Santiago from Cervera's sunken fleet and bound for Norfolk in tow, has been lost at sea.

She Was in Tow. The cruiser Maria Teresa left Calmanera, Cuba, on the morning of Oct. 30 for New York.

Cervera's Flagship. The Infanta Maria Teresa was the flagship of Admiral Cervera, and was one of the Spanish ships.

The Infanta Maria Teresa, to give the sunken cruiser her full name, was classed as a first-class 7000-ton armored cruiser.

THREE MILES UNDER WATER. The crew saved and landed at Charleston on Saturday.

Washing the bodies of the crew of the loss of the Spanish cruiser came to the Navy Department's attention.

At the time the vessel sank she was about 230 miles distant from Nassau.

The greatest regret was expressed in official circles regarding the loss of the Maria Teresa.
