

CONSCRIPTION OF IRISH IS BEATEN; MAJORITY IS 172

Asquith Objects But Won't Try To Force a Change.

WANT HOME RULE FIRST

Labourites and Others Demand Self-Government Precede Conscription.

At Derry Forty Shipworkers Rush To Volunteer and Beat Compulsion.

London, April 13.—A proposal by Irish Nationalists to omit the conscription of Ireland clause from the Government bill was rejected by a majority of 172 in the House of Commons last night. The total vote shows that a large section of the House abstained from voting.

The debate in the House yesterday and last night was remarkable for the speech of Mr. Asquith, who, while strongly objecting to the conscription of Ireland, frankly declined to take the responsibility of the Government in the matter. He said that the Government was facing a grave military crisis of pushing that opposition to the extent of forcing a change in the Government.

Henry E. Duke, chief secretary for Ireland, made a brave attempt to conciliate the Irish members of the House, but failed to bring about a strong alteration with the Nationalists at the close of the debate.

The Government spokesman in the House, Andrew Bonar Law, in a brief speech winding up the discussion, contended that the Government had a moral right in what they were doing, and would be craven not to do it.

"We could not tell America she had the right to conscript Irishmen in the United States while we had no right to conscript them at home," he said. "We have no right to conscript them at home, but we have a right to conscript them in the United States, and we will do so."

This statement brought fresh uproar and laughter from the Irish members. Give Home Rule First. William Adamson, on behalf of the Labour party, appealed to the Government to give a clear assurance that conscription would not operate until a generous measure of home rule had been introduced. Capt. L. C. M. S. Amery, a Unionist, joined in the appeal of Mr. Adamson and Arthur Henderson, Labour leader, for the immediate introduction of a measure of home rule. Mr. Amery, who was speaking for the Unionist benches, said that the Government had no right to conscript Irishmen in the United States while we had no right to conscript them at home.

Another Unionist, Mr. Herbert L. Samuel, former postmaster-general, declared that the most important statement of the day was that the act for setting up a conscription in Ireland should be passed before any Irish measure was called to the colors. Mr. Duke interrupted: "I did not say that."

Five Labour members of the convention noted that they made certain temporary concessions, which, as democrats and representatives of labor, they strongly dislike. HOW VIEWS DIFFER. London, April 13.—The convention adopted a resolution against conscription and appealing to President Wilson for "protection." At the same time the convention issued a statement pointing out that Ireland is in duty bound to contribute her portion, be the war long or short, of the cost incurred; to do less would be to surrender, which Ulster, at the present time, is unwilling to do, her share in the great empire which is our common glory and our common heritage.

The Ulster statement says that successive elections have shown that the majority of the Nationalists are controlled by a party of open and avowed treason, the statement adds, after pointing out the growth of the Sinn Féin movement that "it is pretty obvious that a general election on an Irish parliamentary basis would result in the power in the hands of a party which is in drilling and preparing with German arms and munitions, and with a view to strike a blow at the heart of the British Empire."

UKRAINE HAS CLAIM ON BESSARABIA, AND WOULD BE CONSULTED

Sends Note to Rumania Asking Voice in Negotiations.

AMSTERDAM, April 12.—According to Berlin dispatches, the premier of Ukraine has sent a note to the Rumanian Government, pointing out, as Bessarabia is inhabited by a large number of Ukrainians and the Ukrainian Government controls an important part of the Black Sea coast in the western portion of Bessarabia, the Ukrainian Government maintains that any final decision on the Bessarabian Diet has been reached in the union of that region with Rumania.
