

Longboat Is 2 to 1 Favorite

NOTE AND COMMENT

As expected, Bobby Kerr scored five points and Canada's first win, yesterday at the Olympic. And now it is Dominion day in earnest with anything up to nine points in the pole vault.

The final confirmation as to Longboat's eligibility to start in the Marathon came yesterday in the C. A. P. cable, that gave his position with three other Canadians in the first row. However, with an additional protest, lodged by the Federation, Leslie Boyd of Montreal, many will only feel sure when the race is over and the great Indian runner's number goes up or that of some other Canadian.

As the race starts at 12:30 London time, which is 7:30 in Toronto, and will take about two hours and forty minutes, the news should reach Toronto before 10 o'clock. Longboat is one of the big power houses have agreed to blow their whistles. And may there be a general cheering of steam!

So sure were the Tankers of Rector winning that they bet on him, and they bet 5 to 1 on his chances, and as they say about the horses, he had to do his best to get the place.

The Canadian and American Associated Press stories agree on Kerr's margin at the finish of the 200 metres final. The margin was one inch, and the commissioner has it two yards, and another says it was the "narrowest margin."

If Bobby Kerr did get beaten by Walker of South Africa, he is still a champion sprinter of England, while one Rector can only claim honors in his own country, that is unfortunately tarnished in athletics by an organization that is held up to ridicule as the A. A. U.

Manager Larry Schaffy is living up to his motto. His first win was in the last innings. It did happen to be the 10th. His first defeat was no one run affair and yesterday's victory was of the ordinary kind.

Poor Buck Freeman, who in days gone used to delight the fans with his valour over into the bay at the island, is now practically out of the game for good. Archibald, who has been in the vault, has a three-point pole which he sticks in the ground and climbs, and he is the worst kicker against our men digging the hole, the pole is not allowed. I have small hopes of our chances at first."

Still they are not all kickers across the line like Jim Sullivan, who, by the way, secured his latest additional boost from Tom Flanagan, the latter having christened his Irish mule Jimmy S., after the Boss.

In a recent letter, The New York Herald J. W. Carroll tells his own history when he expresses his regret at the action of the squealers at Olympia. I was over there last month and know that everything possible has been done to make the games and sports an unequalled success in every sense."

Did they want a brass band to march ahead of them thru London, or what? Then, nothing to do on Sunday; no theatre open. Ye gods! What manner of men these who, arriving in a town like London, full of history and traditions, surrounded by the most beautiful country, can find nothing to do because the theatres are not open."

Longboat Full of Confidence

Indian, at Windsor, Says He Never Felt Better—Canadians Indignant.

(Canadian Associated Press Cable.) LONDON, July 23.—The greatest indignation is excited by the Canadians at the action of Leslie Boyd in protesting Longboat. It is felt that he is playing into the hands of Jim Sullivan, and the Indian is wounded in the house of his friends. Boyd declares in a letter to the Olympic Council that Longboat is ineligible, being under disqualification by the Amateur Athletic Federation of Canada for competition in unsanctioned meetings in Canada.

He formally protested against Longboat competing in the Marathon for the purpose of protecting hereafter in America all athletes who are registered with the federation.

Longboat, when seen by the Canadian Press at Windsor to-night, looked fit to run the race of his life. He has a bruised leg and his feet are somewhat blistered, but in a fast trial run this morning he found that neither of these things would be a disadvantage. He is full of confidence. "I am going to do my utmost to win to-morrow and whoever beats me will have to go some. I never felt better."

Longboat added that he prefers racing as he could stand the greater than white man. There is, however, every indication that the day will be scored by him. Coach Crocker is still of the opinion that Simpson is a better man than Longboat. Everyone is enthusiastic about the course, which is declared to be the best in the world.
