

Resolved, That a Standing Committee of this Synod be appointed, to which shall be referred the report of the Commission on Education, and all matters connected with the advancement of the Christian Education of the youth of this Diocese; and that such Committee be authorized to raise means by voluntary contributions, to carry out the recommendations of the report, any funds or property so acquired to vest in and be under the control of the Synod, though under the control of such Standing Committee.

And on the question being taken it passed in the affirmative. In conformity with the preceding resolution, Mr. Frith, the Rev. Dr. Jarvis, the Rev. Canon Medley, the Rev. G. Schofield, the Rev. J. Pearson, Mr. Blair, and Mr. G. S. Smith, were appointed a Committee.

As the Bishop being obliged to leave, it was moved by the Rev. Canon Ketchum, seconded by the Rev. Dr. Jarvis, and resolved, That the Rev. Canon Scovil do take the Chair.

A motion of the Hon. Mr. Justice Allen, seconded by the Rev. G. M. Armstrong, the thanks of the Synod were offered to the Bishop for his able and courteous conduct in the Chair. The Rev. Mr. Dowling moved, and the Rev. Canon Ketchum seconded,

That the Committee on Education be requested to consult with the Madras Board in order to further the interests of Church Education in the Diocese, and report to the Synod at the next Annual Meeting.

And on the question being taken it passed in the affirmative. The Hon. Judge Allen moved, and Mr. Wilkinson seconded,

That the Parish of Fredericton shall be entitled to elect four representatives, provided they are stated attendants at the Cathedral or Parish Church, and otherwise qualified as provided by the Constitution.

And on the question being taken it passed in the affirmative by a majority of both orders.

A motion of the Rev. G. M. Armstrong, seconded by the Rev. J. Smith, it was

Resolved, That the thanks of the Synod be offered to our laymen and friends in the City of Fredericton for their kindness and hospitality to the clerical delegates during the present meetings.
