For the year 1884 we find by actual count 36,359 names, an increase over 1883 of 2,767; this increase represents an additional population of 8,301. To account for so large an increase we would mention that Yorkville having been taken into the City as a Ward (St. Paul's), accounts for about 4,000, so that the actual growth of the City during the year just passed shows the healthy number of over 4,000 souls.

In the compilation of this edition, we have endeavored to surpass all previous efforts, and have spared neither pains or expense to make it a creditable production and a fitting representation of the City's importance in the many parts of the globe where copies of this work are sent.
